PADEL WOMEN'S RULES

Qualifications

- The top 2 teams from each group will qualify.
- · Ranking will be determined based on Points and Wins.
- · In case of teams finishing the league round with equal points, qualification will be decided based on point difference.

Basic Gameplay

- Padel is played in doubles (two players per team) on a court smaller than a tennis court, enclosed by walls.
- The game starts with a serve, which must be hit underhand and bounce in the opponent's service box.
- The ball must hit the ground before touching any part of the enclosure (walls or fence) on the serve.

- The scoring system is the same as tennis: points are counted as 15, 30, 40, and game.
- League match, Quarter Finals and Semi Finals is 1 set raise of 6 games.
- Finals is 1 set raise to 9 games.
- · Golden point if there is dues.

- Serves must be hit underhand and bounce within the opponent's service box.
- The server has two attempts to get the serve in the correct service box.
- The serve must land in the diagonal service box across the net.

Ball in Play

- After the serve, players can hit the ball after it bounces once on their side or directly hit it off the walls.
- The ball can hit the walls after it bounces on the ground, but must return to the opposing side of the net.
- Players can use the walls on their side of the court to return the ball over the net.

• Faults and Points - A point is lost if:

- The ball bounces twice on the ground before being returned.
- The ball hits the net and lands on the server's side.
- The ball hits the enclosure directly without bouncing on the ground first.
- The ball bounces outside the play area.
- · A player hits the ball into the net.
- · A player touches the net or the opposing side's court.

Let and Replays

- o A "let" is called when a served ball touches the net but lands in the correct service box, allowing for a re-
- o If any external interference affects the game, a let is called, and the point is replayed.

Player Conduct

- Players must respect their opponents, officials, and the rules of the game.
- Unsportsmanlike behavior, such as arguing with the referee or opponents, can result in penalties.
